PRAYER FOR PEACE - DIVERSITY We call good race relations among us something different now. It’s called “diversity.” We do not accept some persons of different age, sex, or skin color to hold office, to chair committees. Our own small town is not entirely diverse in the true sense of the word. We don’t enthusiastically seek diverse persons to join our groups or to sit at our tables, do we? Over time, maybe into the next generation, the new habits of acceptance of our young people may take precedence. For the time being, however, we are stuck with the upbringing we had and the prejudices our parents taught us. We need courage, thoughtfulness, kindness and honesty to face those parts of ourselves that we don’t want to admit linger with us. *Dear God, help us to rejoice in the beauty of each person, and of each race, that we may cherish them, and thereby live as your beloved community. Give us the strength to leave the old ways. Show us the joy of sharing every part of our very diverse universe with all who live in it. Amen.*
